These dates follow the Messianic Calendar put out by Messianic Sabbath. Here's how the dates are calculated: The Gregorian calendar overlaid by the Hebrew Diaspora calendar and modified incorporate Yah's appointed times as given by Moshe and synchronized to start each Hebrew month on the new moon as it would be seen from the Temple Mount in Jerusalem. This new moo calculated using lunar phase software that can pinpoint the moon's position and phase at any time from any latitude/longitude on earth. I echo the statement included in their calendar, "Our calendar is not perfect, but our hope is that all Messianic believers who use this calendar will learn to keep the Sabbaths and the feasts in the way that YHWH has impressed upon us individually."
